'MY SPIRIT SANG ALL DAY...'

During the late flowering of English Romantic music composers such as Elgar, Parry and Finzi turned to the Romantic poets for inspiration. Emotionally charged and vividly descriptive texts provided composers with ample opportunity to draw on their musical imaginations. Expressive detail and rich harmonies enabled them to create an appropriate musical language to illuminate and amplify the themes and ideas expressed in the poet's words. The listener is immersed in the emotional and spiritual world created by these intensely passionate and lucid works.

'YOU SHALL HAVE MUSIC...'

We turn from the heights of poetic expression to poetry of the people. For centuries the desires, loves, woes and fears of everyday life have found expression in ballads and lyric songs. Vaughan Williams and Gustav Holst take these simple poems and weave them into a delicate musical fabric of longing and unrequited love. In contrast, the final song in this section is a faux North American folk song written by two of the 20th centuries most urbane and sophisticated artists. The humour of Auden's text is offset by Britten's gentle waltz with its murmuring, watery refrain.

Harris has set many of Shakespeares best known works in a series of popular publications with musical styles ranging from Country and Western to Renaissance parody. In two of the pieces we have chosen Harris responds to Shakespeare's outwardly naïve and carefree words with trilling bird-song and country rhythms. However, the Poet's message is not far beneath the musical surface of these engaging works.

But first, Shakespeare and Harris join together to remind us of the transitory nature of life.
